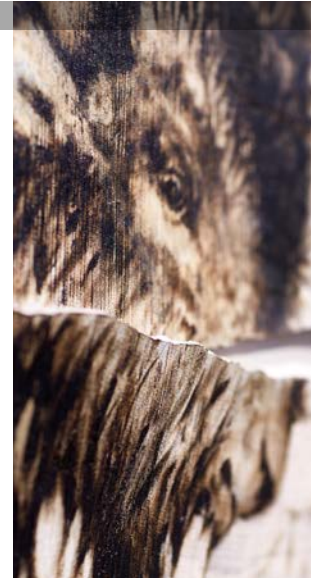

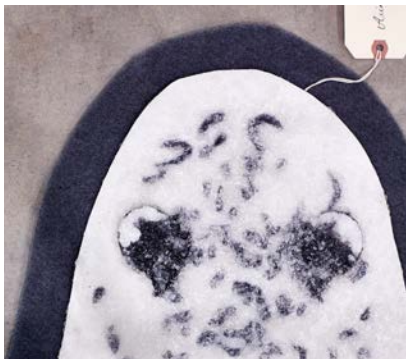
GALLERY INSTALLATION 1 Paintings of rifle engravings, historically sourced wood and pigment

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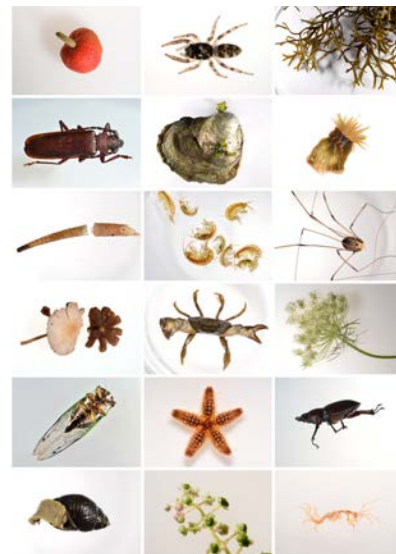
GALLERY INSTALLATION 2 Trophy heads and skins in crushed glass; blown glass and silvered tusks
